Track A Briefing: Women Stopping War

Drawing on the experience of several WMM members and superb staff from the Institute for Inclusive Security, we will participate in training exercises used with the most senior women leaders in some 40 conflict areas.

Track B Briefing: Economic Security Through a Gender Lens What do we mean when we speak of "economic security and justice" for women and families? Find out in a discussion with Anne Mosle (Executive Director, Ascend at The Aspen Institute) (confirmed) and Celinda Lake (President, Lake Research Partners and leading political strategist) (confirmed). They will present new and groundbreaking research on the economic reality for U.S. women and what might be done to improve it.

Track A: Women Stopping War

Using Abby Disney's new five-part PBS series, we'll discuss the particular and powerful strengths that women leaders bring to street protests, mediation, formal negotiations, truth commissions, tribunals, disarming and reintegrating soldiers, post-conflict anti-corruption campaigns, etc. Some of our members are working in Rwanda and Liberia. Others are



working in Israel and Palestine, Afghanistan, Sudan and Egypt. In each situation, policy-makers need to be convinced to open the maledominated peace processes to powerful women. We'll decide which arguments to use in our next session and practice delivering the message.

Track B: Economic Security Through a Gender Lens
