What is Horizon 2020 and why does it matter for a Healthcare company?

Horizon 2020 (H2020) is the financial instrument implementing the Innovation Union, a Europe 2020 flagship initiative aimed at securing Europe's global competitiveness. Running from 2014 to 2020 with a €70 billion budget, the EU's new programme for research and innovation is part of the drive to create new growth and jobs in Europe.

H2020 provides major simplification through a single set of rules. It will combine much of the research and innovation funding currently provided through different pillars and aims to move closer to market with greater emphasis on innovation.

The Health KTN believes that through H2020 this new approach is one of the best opportunities for SMEs and other UK businesses to access new routes of European funding to support innovation for the next seven years – our aim is to enable this sector to be aware and be prepared for H2020.

To give examples of success to date, through FP7 Health and Biotechnology calls UK business has already accessed over €74m of European funding for research and innovation. It is the EC intention that from the overall H2020 budget, c. €7bn will be for Health and at least 20% of this should support SMEs. New instruments to support SMEs are being designed for H2020 to provide more opportunities for industry. H2020 has something for everyone involved in healthcare from pharmaceutical, biologics, medical devices, diagnostics, e-health, assisted living, and from discovery to design, prototyping, manufacture, pre-clinical and clinical trials.

Key drivers which support the Health sector include:

- Strengthening industrial leadership in innovation Major support to societal challenges in particular Health, demographic change and wellbeing.
- Major investment in key technologies:
 - nanotechnologies, advanced materials, biotechnology, advanced manufacturing and processing, ICT and space, and support for cross-cutting actions
- Greater focus on public-private partnership programmes, where industry helps drive the Agenda, including IMI (Innovative Medicines Initiative)
- Greater access to capital/risk finance
- Growing support for innovation in SMEs.
