Petrie, MD, is a Professor of Clinical Psychiatry at Vanderbilt University Medical Center and is the director of the Senior Assessment Clinic, where older patients with memory and behavioral symptoms are treated. He earned both his M.D. and B.A. at Vanderbilt University. Dr. Petrie's research and clinic interests include: Alzheimer's Disease, Frontotemporal Dementia and Psychotic Disorders in the elderly. Dr. Petrie is also an active board member of Mental Health America of Middle Tennessee.

Laurie A. Lebo PhD, CCRP, PMP, holds a PhD in public health from U.T. Knoxville, a Master's Degree in Health & Exercise Science from Missouri-Columbia, and a B.A. in Food Science & Nutrition from Missouri-Columbia. She is the National ResearchMatch Program Manager at Vanderbilt Medical Center.
