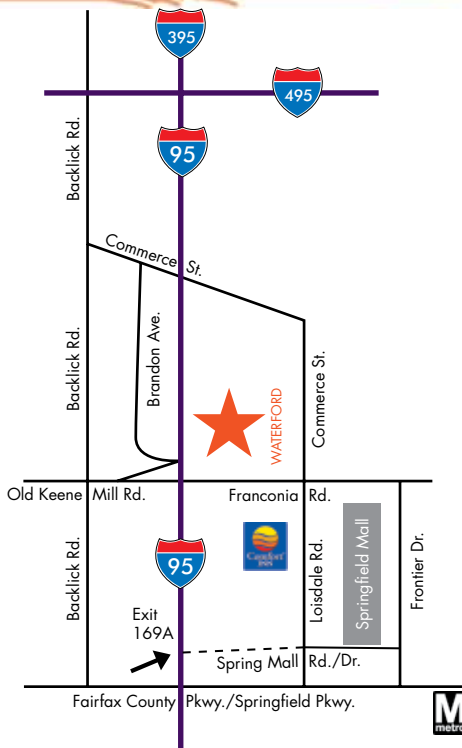

From I-66: Take I-495 exit 64A toward Richmond. Follow signs for VA-644 (Springfield). Take the VA-644 W. Old Keene Mill Rd exit toward Springfield. Bear right onto the Brandon Ave. Stay right on Brandon to traffic light at Brandon/Commerce. Turn right on Commerce and follow to the Waterford on the right.
