

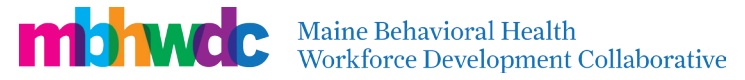
ABOUT OUR PRESENTERS

Patricia A. Burke, MSW, LCSW, BCD, CCS

Patricia Burke is a Board Certified Diplomat in Clinical Social Work; a Certified Clinical Alcohol Tobacco and Other Drug Social Worker; and a Certified Clinical Supervisor with over 30 years of clinical and teaching experience. Patricia is a nationally recognized trainer. She has been a member of the Motivational Interviewing Network of Trainers since 2003 and trains widely on the use of MI in addiction treatment, mental health and behavioral health settings. She is currently on the faculty of Union Institute & University's BA and MA programs and developed the Addiction Studies Specialty for the BA program. Patricia was on the faculty of the Rutgers Summer School of Alcohol and Drug Studies from 1989-2010. She has been an instructor for the Addiction Technology Transfer Center of New England since 1999 and a trainer for the Co-Occurring Collaborative Serving Maine since 2006. She has also been on the faculty of the New England Institute of Addiction Studies, the University of New England School of Social Work, University of Southern Maine, and Southern Maine Community College. Patricia has a private clinical and consulting practice in Biddeford, Maine.

Teresa Valliere is the former director of inpatient services for a women's substance abuse and co-occurring disorders residential continuum of care. In previous positions, she has led an ACT team; supervised a large detoxification and rehabilitation center specializing in co-occurring disorders, relapse prevention and early recovery for men and women; facilitated groups for anger management; and worked with domestic violence offenders. For more than 10 years, she has facilitated trainings on addiction, mental illness, co-occurring disorders, and supervision for a wide variety of agencies and organizations. She served as adjunct faculty for North Carolina State University, University of New England and University of Southern Maine in social work and counseling. She currently serves as visiting faculty in the psychiatry residents program at Maine Medical Center, teaching the social and cultural aspects of psychiatric care. She has expertise in trauma and recovery, relational theory, motivational interviewing and clinical supervision. She maintains a private practice in Portland serving adults, with a special focus on caring for caregivers through training, supervision, and self-care counseling for professionals in mental health, addiction, medical, legal and other helping professions.



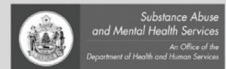

THE FUNDAMENTALS OF EFFECTIVE AND ETHICAL CLINICAL SUPERVISION

TRACK A: One-Week Training/30 Contact Hours

WHEN: Monday, October 28 - Friday, November 1, 2013 (5 days)

FEE: \$250

This one-week course on clinical supervision includes six hours of each of the following subjects: Professional Responsibility and Ethics, Skills Assessment and Self-Evaluation, Clinician Professional Development, Management and Administration, and Case Studies and Clinician Self-Care. This training fulfills the initial educational requirements for Certified Clinical Supervisor (CCS) and is useful for new and veteran supervisors. The format involves lectures, self-evaluation, and small and large group discussions.

TRACK B: Monday and Friday only/12 Contact Hours

WHEN: Monday, October 28 and Friday, November 1, 2013 (2 days)

FEE: \$100

This two-day course on clinical supervision includes six hours of each of the following subjects: Skill Assessment and Self-Evaluation and Case Studies and Clinician Self-Care.

TRACK C: Ethics & Social Responsibility only/6 Contact Hours

WHEN: Thursday, October 31, 2013 (1 day)

FEE: \$50

This one day course on clinical supervision includes professional responsibility and ethics.

CONTACT HOURS • 6 provided each day. Certificates will be available upon completion of an online evaluation.

This training provides 6 contact hours for nurses.
