This is a day-long program designed to address the social, cultural, clinical, and campus-specific concerns of service members and veterans. This program includes specific discussion of campus outreach and planning, and is appropriate for both clinical and non-clinical campus personnel.

Curriculum includes interactive, didactic, and workshop components that address multicultural understanding of service members and veterans, campus-specific challenges, deployment cycle stressors, outreach discussion and workshop, and an introduction to evidence-based treatments of PTSD - Prolonged Exposure Therapy (PE) and Cognitive Processing Therapy (CPT).

This course is designed for clinical mental health providers including counseling center staff psychologists and social workers, pre-doctoral interns, graduate-level externs, graduate-level clinical students, campus psychiatrists, disability services staff, local community providers, and regional community college providers. Non-clinical campus personnel can include individuals working in Student Affairs, Residence Life, Dean's Office, academic advising, registrar's office, Financial Aid, Campus Safety, or any other university department.
