#### **PROGRAM DETAILS:**

Session 1: 1:05-2:00 p.m.

Title: Engaging Adult Learners: 8 Keys To Success Presenter: Sharon Mylrea, UW-Oshkosh CCDET

Description: In this interactive session, eight keys associated with successful adult education programs will be discussed and illustrated using actual examples from established UW-Oshkosh CCDET programs. For example, one key characteristic is including variety in both training content and delivery. Areas for discussion will include the use of media, lecture, handouts, structured activities and focused discussion. The importance of incorporating different methods to meet the needs of adults with diverse learning styles will be emphasized. The eight characteristics form the foundation for designing, developing and conducting effective adult education programs. Participants will be able to apply principles to their own training programs.

Title: What Makes Our Training Successful? Presenter: Al Guyant, Guyant & Associates

Description: Recalling his 30 years of training experience, Al Guyant will give his candid and honest "best guesses" regarding why most of his training sessions earn high evaluations. He will explain what he did to make improvements, including what he added or deleted.
