Alison Tickell, CEO, Julie's Bicycle

Alison established Julie's Bicycle in 2007 as a non-profit with a mission to make environmental sustainability intrinsic to the business, art and ethics of the creative industries. Julie's Bicycle is working with over 1,000 organisations in the UK and internationally, helping them reduce their environmental impacts and develop new thinking in tune with global environmental challenges. Alison is also Associate Professor at Buckinghamshire New University, a trustee of Sound Connections and a fellow of the RSA. Previous roles include Music Director at Creative and Cultural Skills and Director at Community Music, and lead consultant for the National Skills Academy.

Bryan Raven, Managing Director, White Light

Bryan has been with the company for 25 years. His career started with a brief spell at Theatre Projects after spending two years realising that lighting was a lot more fun than mechanical engineering at Imperial College. White Light is now one of the biggest suppliers of lighting equipment for live performance in the UK. Traditionally known for supplying theatre shows such as Miss Saigon, Sister Act & Mary Poppins; the company has diversified much since moving to Wimbledon in 2001 and provides hire, sales, technical service and installations for theatre, concert touring, events, film and television, architectural and education projects.

Robin Barton, Lighting Systems Technician, Royal Opera House

Robin has been fascinated by technical theatre for twenty-five years and currently works in the Lighting Systems department of the Royal Opera House. He is heavily involved in work to make performance lighting more environmentally friendly both within the Royal Opera House and the wider industry, and is founder and coordinator of the Green Lighting Social network.

Rob Halliday, Lighting Designer and Programmer

Rob has been working on shows around the world for the last twenty years, sometimes as lighting designer (including 'Hello Dolly', 'Goodnight Barcelona' and others), sometime as lighting programmer (including 'Evita' and 'Red' in New York, 'Merrily We Roll Along' in London), sometimes just writing about the work of others for magazines including 'Lighting & Sound International' and 'Live Design'. He also created the FocusTrack documentation software when he realised he couldn't remember everything about all those shows without help!

Adam Bennette, Technical Director, ETC Europe

Adam Bennette specializes in LED technology and dimming and power delivery systems for entertainment lighting, including harmonic currents, electromagnetic interference and CE compliance. ETC is a global leader in the design and manufacture of lighting products and the creation of LED lighting solutions.

Simon has been a scenery builder for over thirty years and recently look time out to complete a degree in environmental engineering. His research into the environmental

impacts of different materials commonly used in set construction has contributed to the development of the IG Tool carbon calculator for production, and assisted many organisations in better understanding the environmental impact of their approach to production.

Soutra Gilmour, Scenic and Costume Designer

Soutra is a scenic and costume designer based in London. She has worked with some of the UK's most prestigious organisations, and is an ambassador for sustainable approaches to design practice, from practicalities to aesthetics. Her design credits most recently include: *Antigone* (National Theatre), *Duchess of Malfi* (Old Vic), *Moon on a Rainbow Shawl* (National Theatre), *Reasons to be Pretty* (Almeida), *Inadmissible Evidence* (Donmar Warehouse).

Laura Pando, Sustainability Manager, Festival Republic

Laura is Sustainability Coordinator at Festival Republic. Since March 2011 she's worked on measuring and reducing the environmental impact of Reading & Leeds and Latitude festivals focusing on audience travel behaviour, power and energy monitoring and waste management. In 2012 Reading and Latitude Festivals achieved 3 star Industry Green certifications, the highest rating available. Laura has also overseen the environmental performance of other festivals such as Orlando Calling in the USA, Electric Picnic in Ireland and Berlin Festival in Germany.

Lucy Doherty, Director, Milk Presents Theatre Company

Lucy is a director and facilitator from York. She is a founding member of Milk Presents Theatre Company and directs the work of the company. Directing credits for Milk Presents include: *Self-Service*, *A Real Man's Guide to Sainthood*, *Strawberries and Steam* (Berry Youth Theatre), *Bluebeard: A Fairytale for Adults*, *454 Grams*.
