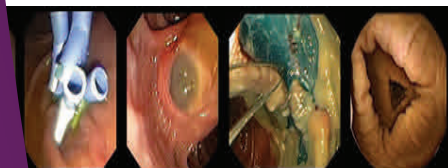
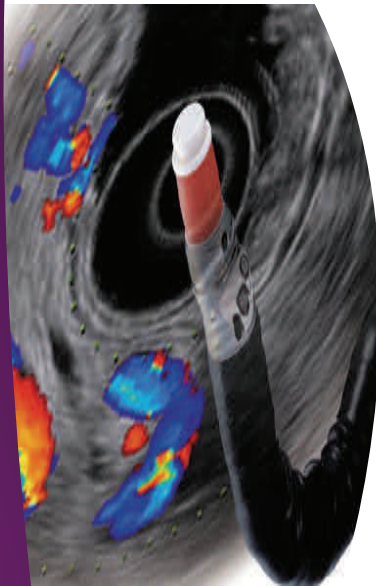

# 1ST ANNUAL SUNY LIVE ENDOSCOPY COURSE 2012

## SEPTEMBER 28, 2012



### COURSE DESCRIPTION

The 1st SUNY Live Endoscopy Course 2012 will consist of didactic lectures and live case demonstrations conducted by faculty with noted expertise in Advanced Therapeutic Endoscopy and broadcast from SUNY Downstate Medical Center, Stony Brook University Medical Center, and Winthrop-University Hospital. The purpose of this course is to provide a critical review of the role of Advanced Therapeutic Endoscopy in gastroenterology, surgery and oncology. This course will provide a thorough update of the most recent advances in endoscopic technology and equipment, and a step-by-step guide to performing procedures. Dr. Priya A. Jamidar will present the keynote lecture "Update on Diagnosis and Treatment of Sphincter of Oddi Dysfunction." Additional lectures will be provided by course faculty.

### TARGET AUDIENCE

This course is designed for practicing gastroenterologists, GI fellows, surgeons, GI nurses and associates.

### EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVES

Upon completion of this course, the attendee should be able to:

- Understand the role of endoscopy (EUS, ERCP) in the diagnosis and/or treatment of pancreaticobiliary disease;
- Recognize new approaches to manage pancreatic and biliary disorders;
- Recognize the novel endoscopic treatments in the GI tract, and appreciate their relative roles in the context of other therapies;
- Differentiate the various endoscopic modalities involved in evaluating patients with obscure GI bleeding, and understand their relative roles for deeper access into the small intestine;
- Recognize the diagnostic and therapeutic tools to manage patients with Barrett's esophagus;
- Understand the clinical roles for combination EUS and ERCP procedures, and new interventional EUS techniques to facilitate EUS-guided therapy; and
- Discuss the role and limitations of endoscopic techniques in treating mucosal and submucosal lesions of the gastrointestinal tract.

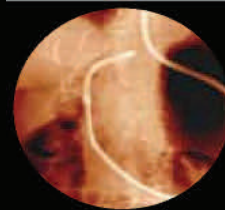

### BY SUBWAY

During rush hour, take the Flatbush Avenue Line (#2 Seventh Avenue or #5 Lexington Avenue) trains to the Winthrop Street station. [Take any Brooklyn-bound train (#2, 3, 4, or 5) to Nevins Street in Brooklyn, changing there for a #2 or #5 marked "Flatbush Avenue". Note that the #5 runs only during rush hours.] Exit at Nostrand and Parkside Avenues. Cross Nostrand Avenue and walk one block on Parkside Avenue until it ends at New York Avenue. Turn right onto New York Avenue. Cross New York Avenue and walk east on Clarkson Avenue until the entrance at 450 Clarkson Avenue.
